When a deadly tornado tore through Monroe County, Mississippi, in late March, Amory Humane Society's shelter suffered severe damage with animals still inside.

Team BVSPCA answered the call from the ASPCA to welcome adoptables from the devastated area. "Our specialized expertise in large intakes and disaster response, along with strong national partners like ASPCA, positions us well to act quickly in times of crisis. Caring for Pets of People Transitioning from Homelessness

In May, the Brandywine Valley SPCA unveiled a new partnership with the Springboard Collaborative to support pet owners transitioning from homelessness in Pallet Village (Georgetown).

Together, we teamed up for the first free pet wellness day, where medical director Dr.

Sheri Wood and our medical team provided wellness exams, vaccinations, and free surgery services. Residents also received free pet supplies such as food, litter boxes, litter, toys, leashes, and harnesses to ease the stresses of their transition.

"I wouldn't be here if I couldn't have kept my cats. It means a lot to have them here. The BVSPCA helped update their shots," raved Debbie, a Pallet Village resident. This partnership expands on the safety net programs we are proud to offer, ensuring the residents of Pallet Village and pet families in our community never face the harsh decision of living without shelter or parting with their beloved companions.

Letter From the CEO

Dear Friends.

As we round out 2023, I'm proud to be able to report new benchmarks in our life-saving work. It truly is amazing what we accomplish when we walk side by side to help pets in need. But there is always work to be done and a national animal crisis we continue to navigate.

Nationally, Animal Welfare organizations are struggling. Over 100,000 more animals are in shelters now than in previous years,

causing shelters to be overwhelmed as they take in more and more unplanned pets, while operating understaffed. Locally, we are seeing the same surge. Even with the increase in animals coming in, we're committed to the individual animals' medical and behavioral journey, and rehabilitation, with the ultimate goal of placement in their forever home.

To help cut down on animal intakes from the local community, the BVSPCA invested in community resources that served more than 5,200 local family pets with discounted spay/neuter surgeries and free vaccines. We also hosted a record-breaking Mega Adoption Event in July that placed 1,469 pets from more than a dozen local and national shelter partners.

It's because of support like yours we can do all of these things while continuing to welcome some 50 animals a day through our doors, serving as Delaware's only open-intake organization for lost, stray, and neglected pets, partnering with Tangipahoa Parish Animal Services in Louisiana to save more lives, and expanding our programs and community resources locally, regionally and nationally to help save the unsavable animals who need us most.


Helping Our Community



\$30 Spay/Neuters Provided to More Than 2,600 Pets

Already this year, 2,600 family dogs and cats have been scheduled for, or have received, special discounted spay/neuter surgery. Through multiple spay/neuter "blitz" promotions backed by a generous donor, we were able to provide the surgeries at a low cost of just \$30 per pet. This discounted community program not only makes the important surgery more accessible to pet families, it also reduces the population of unwanted cats and dogs in the community.

A staple for daily enrichment of our shelter dogs, playgroups became the focus of a very special adoption event this (past) April. Potential adopters were invited to our campuses to see dog-friendly social dogs playing with each other in our expansive play yards. Adopters then could choose





a dog to meet or meet with their own dog to see if they would be a good match. Dogs who may otherwise be overlooked found homes that day because they were able to show their true selves.



For the first time, The Animal Rescue Center (ARC) in Georgetown is now offering adoption hours to the public, expanding our ability to accept and find homes for even more animals in need.

The ARC first opened in January 2019 as a resource for animals in need of extra support to reach adoption. Since then, animal cruelty survivors, disaster victims, newborns and pets at risk of euthanasia at other shelters have found safe haven at the ARC to rehabilitate and get the care they needed as a bridge to adoption. We're now proud to welcome adopters through our doors to meet and add these furry companions to their family.

This state-of-the-art 11,500 square foot facility on 13 acres in Georgetown can house as many as 250 animals at a time.

Dogs at the ARC enjoy large indoor-outdoor runs, floor to ceiling kennel enclosures, heated floors and acres of yards to explore and play.
